



EAA compliant?

The European Accessibility Act (EAA) is now the law.

If you're selling digital products or services within or into the EU, your business must meet EAA requirements.

What you need to know about the EAA

- Enforceable across all 27 EU member states as of June 28, 2025.
- Affects any organization selling digital products or services within or into the EU.
- All support services, including help desks, customer support, training materials, and complaint procedures need to be accessible.
- Information about the service needs to be readily available, including how it operates and functions and its accessibility features.
- The presumed compliance standard for the EAA is the harmonized standard EN 301 549. Many member states have requirements beyond WCAG conformance. For long-term compliance, consider also testing for WCAG 2.2 AA.
- Your accessibility program needs to be sustainable going forward.

Compliance is essential for

- 1. All enterprises within any of the 27 EU member states.
- 2. All global enterprises selling products or services into the EU.

Services

- E-commerce
- Banking services
- Phone services
- Websites and mobile application services
- Electronic tickets
- E-book providers
- Access to audio-visual media services
- European emergency calls (112)

Products

- Computers and operating systems
- Smartphones and other communication devices
- TV equipment related to digital television services
- ATMs and payment terminals
- E-books and E-readers
- Ticketing and check-in machines





5 steps to achieve compliance

Conduct comprehensive accessibility audits and prepare to remediate.

Supply rolebased training to all relevant teams.

Embed accessibility tools in your design, development, and testing practices.

Partner with accessibility experts.

Maintain production, monitor remediation progress, and iterate to improve your accessibility program and processes.
